
## We're funding safety lessons for children

More than 700 children die each year in the UK as a result of unintentional injury and 40,000 children and young people are taken to A & E.

Now we're motoring: Chris Bennett takes the driver's seat as the new wind-powered van is launched

### Driving down emissions

**ScotAsh's** Chris Bennett was in the driving seat at the launch of the UK's first wind powered van in October.

Chris, who Chairs the sustainability group Green Business Fife, went to Methil's Hydrogen Office for the official launch of the van, which will be used by Fife Shopping and Support Services to deliver pensions and groceries to elderly and disabled people.

The van is powered by a wind turbine at the Hydrogen Office, which stores excess wind power via a system of electrolysis and hydrogen fuel cells, to provide energy when the wind doesn't blow.

The electric van will save Fife Shopping and Support Service £1,500 a year and more than 1,800 tonnes of  $CO_2$  emissions.

Energy Minister Fergus Ewing said: "The Hydrogen Office and FS&SS are playing a vital role in demonstrating the link between

Scotland's renewable energy resources and the role fuel cells and energy storage can play in a low-carbon Scotland.

"We are committed to achieving almost complete decarbonisation of road transportation by 2050, along with a mature market for low-carbon cars.

"We welcome initiatives like this and are pressing ahead with similar schemes to help us to achieve our world-leading targets."

Chris Bennett said: "This electric van and charging point is the first of many we hope will be deployed by businesses in Fife in the near future, benefiting the environment by cutting emissions and helping companies through reduced running costs.

"Green Business Fife will play an active role in encouraging others to adopt this green transport solution. We are delighted that the vehicle will be visiting local schools to educate the next generation about the

This has built a robust health and safety culture over many years."
